

Grand Assembly Banner Competition

The banner competition is open to all Rainbow Assemblies and to Pledge Groups. The Pledges should have their own banner.

ALL WORK is to be done by the girls. Adults may teach them skills, take them shopping, and give them guidance. This is not a competition for adults. It is a fun, teambuilding, memory-making contest for kids.

The banner must be made on fabric 30 " wide by 36" long. This includes fringe or any other protuberances.

The assembly name and assembly number must be on the front of the banner.

An unobstructed tube of fabric (such as one that a pole could be placed in), 2" in width, must be across the entire top back of the banner. (Do not bring a pole to Grand Assembly. It will not be used there.)

Three sets of ties, 12" in length for all six pieces of tie, must be attached to the top back of the banner. These are used to tie the banner to the rails at Grand Assembly. They should be of a substantial fabric and one that is easily and securely tied. (Sometimes felt and rickrack are not good choices.)

The banner itself should be made securely. The banners are moved several times at Grand Assembly and no one there will be responsible for damage to them.

There must be no food on the banner and no object of any kind may protrude more than 1/2" from the surface.

A self-addressed stamped envelope must be secured to the banner. (A pin or safety pin works well). The results, when received back from Grand Assembly, will be forwarded to the Mother Advisor.

If Grand Assembly is structured as in other years, girls who are carrying the banner in the banner parade should come to the front of the Mosque during the flag tribute Wednesday night in white gowns and line up in numerical order.

Girls and adults must respect the banners as personal property of the assemblies and refrain from handling them.
